A sower went out to sow with no boundaries!

The parable of the sower is a beautiful story that not only teaches us gardening and growing, but also about listening and receptive to the word of God. Being receptive to the world of God can be challenging especially when there is so much noise in our lives, when our attention span is limited.

The parable of the sower which was told by Jesus exemplifies God's extravagant generosity and boundless love. He is the sower who doesn't pick and choose where to sow. He doesn't discriminate but He generously scatters the seed—His word, anywhere and everywhere. In this story, some of the seeds fall on the bare ground, some fall on a stony place, some fall among the thorns, and some seeds fall on the rich and fertile soil. "The sower of course, doesn't change and the seed doesn't change either. What changes is the soil. What changes are the conditions that allow the seed to be planted. What changes is the environment that lets the seed bear fruit. What changes, in fact, is us. And we may never know where, or how, it will happen."

His seeds are His words and teachings. Do you allow His seed to fall on bare ground, stony or thorny path? Has it been packed down hard by the journey of life? Can Satan easily snatch the valuable and precious truth of God from your life? Consider your heart, whether you can allow that seed to put down roots in a rich soil to help you change your life now, in preparation for the coming of God's Kingdom.

Although, "Our modern world is full of distractions—the rocks, thorns and birds that conspire to prevent God's Word and His calling from taking root and bearing fruit." However, we can change and prevent the distraction. As a good gardener spends a handful of time to weed, to manure and to tend to the garden for productive yield, so also we must take time to tend the 'garden of our soul.' God continues to sow the seeds of the Kingdom that falls on the different kinds of soil. The question to examine from the parable is, what quality of "soil" is your life?

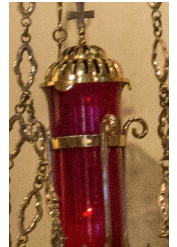
