Tuesday, September 29th is the Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael.

Michael means, "Who is like unto God?" St. Michael is found in both the Old and New Testament and is most known for battling Lucifer and casting the demons out of heaven. For this, he is known as the prince of the angels. He is also regarded as the angel who brings the souls of men to their judgment before God. The Feast of St. Michael is also known as "Michaelmas."

Gabriel means "Power of God." Also present in both the Old and New Testament, he is most known for his appearance at the Annunciation where he greeted Mary, "Hail Mary, full of grace." He is also believed to be the angel who comforted Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Raphael means "God has healed." In the Bible, he is mentioned in Tobit chapter 12 where he was a companion, protector, and healer. He is also believed to be the angel who stirred the water in the healing pool of Bethesda in Jerusalem.
