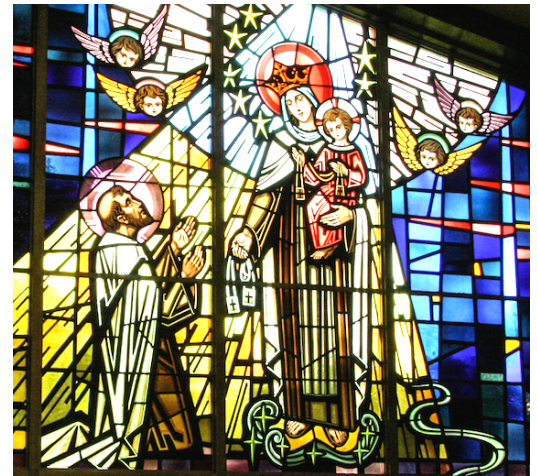

Why go to Mass on Sunday? - continued

Why should we keep the Sunday holy by going to Mass? The Mass was instituted at the Last Supper by Jesus before His Crucifixion. The Last Supper was the first Mass. The Gospel of Luke speaks about the Last Supper as well as the new command given to the apostles. This command is "Do this in memory of me." "And when the hour came, he sat at table and the apostles with him...And he took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in memory of me" (Lk. 22:14-20). Similarly he gave the cup telling them it is his blood which will be his new and everlasting covenant with them. Thus, during Eucharistic celebration the priest acts *in persona christi* (in person of Christ) and recites similar words commanded by Christ. When we celebrate the Mass, we repeat the Last Supper, as Jesus commanded us to do. In doing this, we remember and re-present his great act of love for us on the Cross.

Hence the Church teaches that we must fulfill the command of Jesus ("Do this in memory of me") by attending Sunday Mass (or the Vigil Mass the night before). *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* (# 2041-43) explains that Mass attendance on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is the first of the six Commandments of the Church. Besides these precepts, the Church also requires receiving Communion at least once a year during the Easter season, confessing any mortal sin as a preparation for Communion, and observing the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence. These Commandments obviously spell out the minimal responsibilities of a Catholic. To fail to fulfill them through our own fault, that is, deliberately, the Church teaches, is a serious sin.
