"The Eucharistic prayer, a prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification, is the center and high point of the entire celebration. In an introductory dialogue the priest invites the people to lift their hearts to God in prayer and thanks; he unites them with Himself in the prayer he addresses in their name to the Father through Jesus Christ. The meaning of the prayer is that the whole congregation joins Christ in acknowledging the works of God and in offering the sacrifice." After this the people happily sings or recite "Holy Holy," to honor and welcome the Lord, acknowledging Him to be blessed and holy.

This prayer reminds us when our Blessed Lord made a triumphal entry into the city of Jerusalem. "Triumphant cries rang about His ears; palms dropped beneath His feet, as the air resounded with hosannas to the Son of David and praises to the Holy One of Israel. To those who would have silenced the demonstration in His honor, our Lord reminds them that if their voices were silent, even the very stones would have cried out." The Sanctus (Holy Holy) is sung or said by all the people with the priest.

From this point on, the Church with prayers of the priest implores the Holy Spirit that the gifts of bread and wine made and offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become the body and blood of Christ so that it would bring salvation to those who worthily partake of it in communion. The priest continues the consecration repeating the words of Christ on the last supper. Our Father which is the Lord's Prayer is a petition for our daily bread, forgiveness and purification from sins. The rite of peace follows, by which the Church asks for peace and unity for herself and the whole human family. We share sign of peace with one another showing our ecclesial communion and mutual love for each other. That is, we are one, brothers and sisters in God's family.
