Immediately after the sign of peace has been mutually expressed by the people of God, the priest commences the breaking of bread. This should be carried out with proper reverence. The rite of breaking of bread is reserved to the priest and deacon. Shortly afterwards the presider-priest breaks the bread and puts a piece of the host into the chalice with the prayer, "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The ritual signifies the unity of the body and blood of the Lord in the work of salvation. This is accompanied with the supplication Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) and may be repeated as many times as necessary until the rite has reached its conclusion, the last time ending with the words 'grant us peace.'

Before the communion the priest prays that he will fruitfully receive Christ's body and blood, and the faithful prays silently. After this prayer the priest raises the body of Christ above the chalice or pattern and invites the people to the banquet of Christ. It is important to note that there is no communion without consecration. There is no receiving the bread and wine we offer, until they have been transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Christ. "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at same Mass and that, in instances when it is permitted, they partake of the chalice..."

Receiving Jesus in Holy Communion indeed fortifies us against sin, which damages our relationship with God, heals us of our weaknesses, and empowers us to live holy lives of sacrificial love for one another. "We should strive to receive Holy Communion regularly, gratefully, and worthily. We may find ourselves in situations, however, where an examination of our conscience before God reveals to us that we should refrain from partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ."

6. Children educated in right relationships & what to do if a relationship isn't right.
7. All children treated with dignity and respect.
8. Clear rules and expectations. Consistent reinforcement/ consequences.
9. Adequate supervision of youth.
