## When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?

According to Committee on Doctrine of the USCCB: "In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique, a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church's traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist the "substance" of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the "accidents" or appearances of bread and wine remain."

The term "Substance" and "accident" here are philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith. Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of "accidents" or physical attributes - that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of "substance" or deepest reality). There have been several miracles of consecrated host and wine turning in the form of human flesh and blood respectively. However the change from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "transubstantiation." With faith we can conclude the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. Catechism, no. 1376). "This is a great mystery of our faith—we can only know it from Christ's teaching given us in the Scriptures and in the Tradition of the Church."

We are aware that "every other change that occurs in the world involves a change in accidents or characteristics. Sometimes the accidents change while the substance remains the same. For example, when a child reaches adulthood, the characteristics of the human person change in many ways, but the adult remains the same person—the same substance. At other times, the substance and the accidents both change. Christ's presence in the Eucharist is unique in that, even though the consecrated bread and wine truly are in substance the Body and Blood of Christ, they have none of the accidents or characteristics of a human body, but only those of bread and wine."

3. Code of conduct enforced.
4. Open communication between parents & staff/ staff & children / children & parents.
5. Parents always welcome.
6. Children educated in right relationships and what to do if a relationship isn't right.
7. All children treated with dignity and respect.
8. Clear rules and expectations. Consistent reinforcement/ consequences
9. Adequate supervision of youth.

10. All abuse is reported.
