Why do we pray "Holy Holy Lord God of Host" (Sanctus) at Mass?

The first part of the Sanctus (Holy Holy), the adaptation from Isaiah, describes the prophet Isaiah's vision of the throne of God surrounded by six-winged, ministering seraphim. (cf. Is 6:3). The second part and the final three lines can be found in the Gospel of Matthew, during the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem before His Passion, as the people shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Mt 21:9).

"Hosanna" is a Hebrew term which means "save," It is an expression of entreaty or request translated for example, "I pray," "I beseech," "please." "It was used as part of the Jewish temple liturgy during the feast of Tabernacles, when the priests carried willow branches and cried "Hosanna!" while processing around the altar of burnt offering'. Over time, the crowd gathered to worship picked it up, and it became a cry of joy."

Hence, the excited crowd greeted the Messiah by waving palm branches and joyously crying "Hosanna" to him as he entered Jerusalem. The expression "Hosanna to the Son of David!" is an exhortation to acclaim or praise the Messiah in hopes of deliverance probably from the hated Romans who forcefully occupied their territory demanding them to pay tax. Jesus entry into the city of Jerusalem raised hope that long awaited messiah has arrived to save and deliver them.

The Sanctus reminds us that all creatures on "heaven and earth" owe thanksgiving to God. "It points to the expected presence of the Lord in the Eucharistic gifts" we offer Him. In heaven, the angels and saints worship God and here on earth we join with them in the sacrifice of praise. We are part of a great host or army of servants. In singing or saying the Holy, holy we are calling the Lord to save us. We also remember that we are united to the living and the dead, a great multitude throughout history and beyond who join together in love offering praise and worship to God.
