## “Whatsoever you do to the least of my people you have done to me”

St. Theresa of Calcutta often used the above quote to encourage her audience to do good for others because, at the end, God is going to judge them on how they treated others. While there are many rich people in the world there are also many people living in abject poverty. Thankfully many rich people have used their wealth to establish foundations so as to take care and alleviate the pain and the suffering in the world.

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus in today's gospel is one of the most dramatic and classic of the parables. It's the only one where the main character is given a name – Lazarus. This is classic story of a very rich man who lived a life of extreme luxury. Laid outside the gate of this rich man's house, however, was an extremely poor man Lazarus who simply hoped “to eat what fell from the rich man's table” (v. 21). The rich man was completely indifferent to the plight of Lazarus, showing him no love, sympathy, or compassion whatsoever. Thus, “Christ contrasts the rich man to the poor beggar named Lazarus who was wracked with sores waiting at the gate of the rich man hoping any amount of charity would come his way. Neither the wealthy tycoon nor anyone else gave him an ounce of care.” Their situation reversed at the end of their earthly lives.

However, the moral lesson of this parable reminds us that our decisions and attitudes toward people have lasting consequences. Christ uses this parable to warn his audience that their thoughts and actions will be judged when God calls them back home. The story of the rich man and Lazarus should make us all examine ourselves and use all the opportunity we have to help others according to our own means. Most of all this parable should help us to be mindful of words of Jesus, “Whatsoever you do to the least of my people you have done to me.” May this story motivate you to make a difference in people's life and build a legacy here on earth.
