## DEALING WITH THE UNEXPECTED !

Each of us deal and handle crisis differently. "Moments of crisis reveal aspects of ourselves that we don't face up to very often. They can show where our real self lies." Besides, the way we handle crisis reveals our true character and personality. "Do we react defensively or aggressively out of self-concern, or are we able to see beyond ourselves to the care of others?" Sometimes crisis puts our faith to the test; are we really convinced about God's care and support for us?

Today's gospel presents to us how Joseph dealt with his first marital crisis. Joseph was very close to Mary. However, the unexpected pregnancy of Mary was not a sign to confirm his trust either in her or God, it was a contradictory sign. In the hours of his darkness and confusion he never wanted to act so quickly. As a patient man, he seems to understand the consequences of rash judgments in life. Even our Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "To avoid **rash judgment**, everyone should be careful to interpret insofar as possible his neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds in a favorable way" (2478). It is so easy for Joseph to report Mary to face dire consequences for pregnancy outside of the wedlock but he chooses not to do so. While patient in the moment of his confusion and darkness "he found the enlightening Spirit of God, the Spirit who teaches us not to judge by what our eyes see or by what our ears hear" (cf. Is 11:3.) "This gospel shows us that the signs God gives are not always the ones we would choose for ourselves. He gives signs for those who are willing to take on the darkness of doubt in openness and sincerity."

In the moment of his humility, quietness and patience, God gave answer to Joseph which encourages him not to be afraid to take Mary as his lawful wife for she has indeed conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit. Joseph's action in today's gospel teaches us how to deal with unexpected. It also points to the importance of patience and kindness when dealing with people. More importantly it teaches us in the moment of darkness and confusion to wait upon the Lord for answers.
