## Celebrating Christmas - "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us."

The above phrase captures the true meaning of the incarnation. The gospel of John shows us that "God had come to be with us, among us, in the midst of our ordinary and sinful world." "Notice that John does not say that Jesus was the holy invisible God masquerading in the flesh of a human, or slipping into a costume of skin just for appearance sake. No, in Jesus God became flesh. This is the unfathomable mystery and grace of the Incarnation. God actually came all the way to us, to dwell with us, accepting the limitations and weaknesses of our mortal existence, risking and facing the very resistance and opposition He knew would come, as darkness attempted to snuff out the light."

He was born into the least expected family and the least expected place in the world. On His birthday He was not met or visited by dignitaries, generals, or celebrities. He was rather greeted and visited by poor shepherds, probably smelly and unwashed. "In their time and place they counted so little that their testimony was simply not accepted in any court of law. But it was to those shepherds that God gave His good and wonderful news: I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people."

For more than two years we gather every year to celebrate His birthday-the Christmas. On this day it is so beautiful to see the Church once again parked with many people. It is indeed one of the most joyful religious holidays. We celebrate with joy the birth of our Savior surrounded by family and friends. We also Skype and call our loves ones far away as well as exchanging gifts, giving and receiving. Since the birthday of Jesus is the center of this celebration, may we continue, even after the Christmas, to make Christ present in our lives and in our families. More importantly may we see Christ among the vulnerable, the poor and the less privileged - and strive always to make our world a peaceful, a better place and a home for all. Merry Christmas!

### HISTORY OF THE NATIVITY SCENE

St. Francis of Assisi staged the first nativity scene in a cave outside of the town of Greccio, Italy on Christmas Eve night 1223. It is said that St. Francis was inspired to re-create the nativity scene because he was disgusted with the greed and materialism that was rampant in Italy at that time. He felt that people had forgotten that Jesus came to us not as a rich king but as a poor child. In planning the scene St. Francis wrote to his friend Giovanni, "I want to do something that will recall the memory of that child who was born in Bethlehem, to see with bodily eyes the inconveniences of his infancy, how he lay in the manger, and how the ox and ass stood by."
