

The incredible power and effects of love in our lives and others!

All of us yearn to be loved and to love as well. Love motivates people to go out of their way to do so many unimaginable things and even to make a difference in the world. Some of us feel very complete when they are loved. Love is of course, the most significant nurturing force in friendships, relationship, marriage, family and so forth. Mother Teresa said, "There is more hunger for love and appreciation in this world than for bread." "Being able to love someone unconditionally and to openly receive their deepest love is an energizing emotion. Marriage, partnerships and parenting offer the greatest opportunity to practice such unconditional love." Unfortunately, lack of love has led many of our brothers and sisters to depression and suicide. People are depressed because they do not love themselves or not feel loved by others. Besides, fear, insecurity, anxiety and betrayal of trust has also led many people to put a barrier between them and others.

In today's gospel, Jesus teaches us the greatest commandment is, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself." This means the only way we can tangibly love God is to love another human being not just by feelings and emotions but to respect them, to care for them and to accept them unconditionally. It is not surprising that the first reading from Exodus gives us a further concrete example of love, namely: to reach out and care for the widows, the orphans and aliens in our midst. These were the most vulnerable people then among the Jewish people.

True love can only be expressed concretely when it is accompanied by deeds. For instance, in the last judgment account, Jesus praises the deeds and caring shown to those who are hungry, thirsty, naked, sick, those in prison and so forth. He concludes and warns us, "Whatever you do to the least of these my people you have done it to me." Each one of us must become a mirror that reflects God's love to the world. In the end, you need to ask if you have loved enough those who God has put in your life or even appreciate those who have loved and cared for you. Be willing to love yourself, to forgive yourself, to forgive others, to let go, to love and care for others.
